For those who don't know me, I have been a member of Starfleet since 1988, served as a correspondence chapter CO for 15 years, and am the former Chief of Staff of both Region 12 and Starfleet. A lifelong Trek fan and watcher of the original series when it aired, I answered Bjo Trimble's call and wrote to NBC at the age of 7 to help bring back TOS for its third and final season.

One of my first major duties was representing the chapter at Starfleet's 2014 International Conference in Rockford, Illinois, celebrating Starfleet's 40th anniversary. Being a short five hour drive from St. Louis, I fired up the Admiral's launch, grabbed a bunch of music CDs and set coordinates for Sol III, northern Illinois sector. The last IC I had attended was twelve years ago in San Jose, California, but the time just disappeared the moment I arrived and promptly ran into a number of old friends – David and Linda Kloemp-

ken, former CS Jim Herring, current Ops Chief Robert Westfall, current CompOps Chief Larry French, current Fleet Chief of Staff Denine Sanders, and current CS Wayne Killough, to name a few. There were also a large number of new faces and friends to meet.

The chapter was recognized for perfect on-time MSR reporting and I



also represented our Marine Strike Group during the annual Marine Muster where RADM Paul Dyl received SFMC Academy honors as "Student of the Year" and was inducted into the SFMCA Team Delta. Join me in congratulating him on these outstanding awards!

Other highlights from the International Conference included: the launching of the USS Orion and the commissioning of the USS Missouri, both from Region 12; members attending from as far away as Canada and Scotland; a current total of 4,773 members on 242 chapters in the Fleet; over the last year Fleet lost 13 chapters but gained 11 new shakedown chapters; Honorary Membership awarded to Matt Ingles of Region 15, Lifetime Membership awarded to Laura Victor of Region 7; chapter longevity awards culminating in the recognition of the USS Eagle of Region 4 for 35 years continuous service; the awarding of IC 2016 to Louisville, Kentucky; and the announcement that Star Trek Magazine will feature Starfleet's 40th anniversary in their October issue later this year.

That's it for this issue. Let me settle in and get up-to-speed on our departments, projects and programs (hey, Paul, I can't find the keycode to the executive washroom). I'll have much more to report in the next issue.

- -- AB Meeting Minutes Section: The AB-approved ECAB Minutes from both the Pre-IC Conference Call and the ECAB Meeting at IC (both meetings held in 2013) are now available for review. More of these will be added as they are approved by the Admiralty Board.
- -- Command Status Reports Section: The April edition of the CSR is ready for your review. The May edition is going through final review now and then it will be ready for the website (followed shortly thereafter by the June and July editions).
- -- International Conference Resources Section: At IC I was presented two Proclamations for STAR-FLEET. The first was from Lawrence Morrissey, Mayor of Rockford, who proclaimed the week of August 4, 2014 as "STARFLEET 40th Anniversary Week". The second was from Illinois State Senator Steve Stadelman, who proclaimed that the "Senate of the Ninety-Eighth General

Assembly of the State of Illinois recognize and congratulate STARFLEET on the occasion of its 40th anniversary celebration". Senator Stadelman was actually present at IC to present this proclamation, and it was great meeting him. He was very impressed with the work STARFLEET has accomplished over 40 years and he was excited that IC during our 40th Anniversary was being held in his home state of Illinois.

General Linda Olson and I have been getting a head start on the annual 990 Report that must be filed for STARFLEET. This process isn't too difficult, but for someone who has not had experience with this report, it could lead to some very nasty headaches. I am working on some documentation surrounding this annual report that will hopefully help the next administration with filling it out, submitting it, etc.



our library this month. We still have had some trouble with the database as we continue to archive all the data files. We are making some headway but we are still encountering a hiccup or




two as we move forward. If database management is your interests, we still need you! Please volunteer and lend us a hand.

Things with the Starfleet Special Operations are moving forward. Over the past 2 months I have participated in 8 teleconferences and I am currently assisting with working with Rear Admiral Barry Jackson on procurement for TOS style awards and also working with Fleet captain TJ Allen with the Special Operations Awards Manual.

ALL MACO's, you need to start working on your MACO training quali-

fications. For months now I have been sending out reminders and



hints that if you want to be a MACO, you need to complete your required training courses. Congratulations to Captain James Nelson for completing the Special Operations curses and will soon be a fully qualified Team Leader very shortly. The remaining of will to do is take the SFM-

CA PD-100 exam. This course is required before anyone can take any other courses at the SFMCA. Once you complete that, if you are enlisted, you will need to take the NCO-100 course, if you're an officer, then you will need to complete SFA course OTS.

Once you have completed those courses you are now MACO candidates. You are now ready for your training which has a total of something like 47 courses at the SFA Special Operations Collage. Make sure you're updating me as to your progress. Once you complete these courses you will be a MACO operative. If you have any questions, call me! I will point you to the right resources etc.

The Chief of Communications can have many duties, including, but not limited to: Publication of the chapter 's bi-monthly newsletter the "Guardian", Interaction with the region's Publications Officer and RDC Communications. Assists with the chapter publications such as certificates, Membership Handbook and flyers.

Job Qualifications:

- Be a member of Starfleet in good standing for at least one year.
- Be a member of the Chapter in good standing for at least 6 months.
- Preferably a "knowledgeable" person on the subject matter.
- Passed OTS.
- Passed OCC or working on it which must be completed within six months of appointment to the Chief of Communications position.
- Must have reliable internet access each day.

- Must have reliable e-mail access each day. The fact that the internet and e-mail are now the most used forms of communication force this to be a requirement for a Department Chief.
- Sense of humor and a great attitude. Absolute musts!!!!
- Demonstrated leadership abilities, this could be on your department or in real life or both.
- Have pride and enthusiasm in the chapter.
- The ability to perform duties in a timely and responsible manner.

While it is true that this is a volunteer position, you will have certain duties that MUST be done regularly as a Department Chief.

- Willingness to invest personal time, effort, money for postage, and etc. to perform an important, but sometimes thankless, job for the benefit of Region One's members.
- Specific requirements for the position you are applying for can found in the chapter Membership Handbook under the specific department you are looking for.

Requirements of the Job:

- Must report to the chapter's First Officer each month on or before 10th of the month.
- Contribute to the STARFLEET Communique and Region One CHANNEL 01 on a regular basis.
- •
- Contribute to the chapter newsletter about your department on a regular basis.
- Must continue to contact members and spread the word about your department to new members.
- Must continually improve your department to make it fresh and interesting for the chapter.
- Must take pride in the job and serving as a chapter Department Chief.

If you are interested in applying, send what you think is pertinent in your Real Life Resume and Fleet Resume with a paragraph detailing what you would do with the department if chosen as the Chief Communications Officer.

In case you didn't, here's a great list to get you started (with help from www.immunize.org). Remember – you're never too old to get immunized!

Hepatitis A (Hep A):

You need this vaccine if you have a specific risk factor for hepatitis A virus infection or simply want to be protected from this disease. Most states also require this vaccine for food handling jobs. The vaccine is usually given in 2 doses 6-18 months apart.

Hepatitis B (Hep B):

You need this vaccine if you have a specific risk factor for hepatitis B virus infection or simply want to be protected from this disease. The vaccine is usually given in 3 doses, usually over 6 months.

Human papillomavirus (HPV):

You need this vaccine if you are a woman age 26 years or younger, or a man age 21 years or younger. Men age 22-26 years with a rick condition

also need vaccination. Any other man age 22-26 who wants to be protected from HPV may receive it, also. The vaccine is given in 3 doses over 6 months.

Influenza (flu shot):



You need a dose every fall (get them now if available as the flu experts say it will work during the peak flu season of January-March) for your protection and for the protection of others around you.

Measles, mumps, rubella (MMR):

You need at least 1 dose of MMR if you were born in 1957 or later. You may also need a 2nd dose.

Meningococcal (meningitis):

You need this vaccine if you have one of several health conditions, or if you are 19-21 years old and a military recruit or first-year college student living in a residence hall or dorm and you either have never been vaccinated or were vaccinated before age 16. You also need this vaccine if you had your spleen removed.

Pneumococcal (pneumonia shot):

You need 1 dose at age 65 years (or older) if you've never been vaccinated or you were previously vaccinated at least 5 years ago when you were

younger than 65. You also need 1-2 doses if you smoke cigarettes or have certain chronic health conditions. You also need this vaccine if you had your spleen removed.

Tetanus, diphtheria, whooping cough (pertussis) (Tdap, Td):

All adults who have not yet received a dose of Tdap, as an adolescent or adult, need to get the Tdap vaccine (the adult whooping cough vaccine). After that, all adults need a tetanus booster (Td) every 10 years, or every 5 years for a "dirty" wound (rusty metal, dirt in a wound, animal bites, etc.).

Varicella (chickenpox):

If you've never had chickenpox or were vaccinated but received only 1 dose, talk to your healthcare provider to find out if you need this vaccine.

Zoster (shingles):

If you are age 60 years or older, you should get a 1-time dose of this vaccine now.

Hib (Haemophilus influenza type b):

(Not to be confused with the other influenza shot noted above.) Sonme adults with certain high-risk conditions need the Hib vaccine. Talk to your healthcare provider to find out if you need this vaccine. You also need this vaccine if you had your spleen removed.

Dr. Dave Disclaimer:

Do consult your healthcare provider to determine your level of risk of certain infections and your need for certain vaccines. Travelers to some parts of the world or people with professions that bring them into contact with animals might need other vaccines.



NASA's Curiosity rover is about to conduct some serious scientific drilling at Mars.

The space agency announced Thursday (September 11) that the rover has reached the base of Mount Sharp, its destination since landing

two years ago. Officials say drilling could begin as early as next week at an outcrop of rocks called Pahrump Hills


Mount Sharp, located in ancient Gale Crater, rises nearly 3½ miles.

A scientific review panel has criticized the Curiosity team for an extended mission that involves too much driving and too little sampling. On Thursday, project scientist John Grotzinger of the California Institute of Technology promised "we are going to do a lot more drilling" now that the six-wheel Curiosity is at Mount Sharp.

NASA says Curiosity remains healthy, aside from worn wheels.






