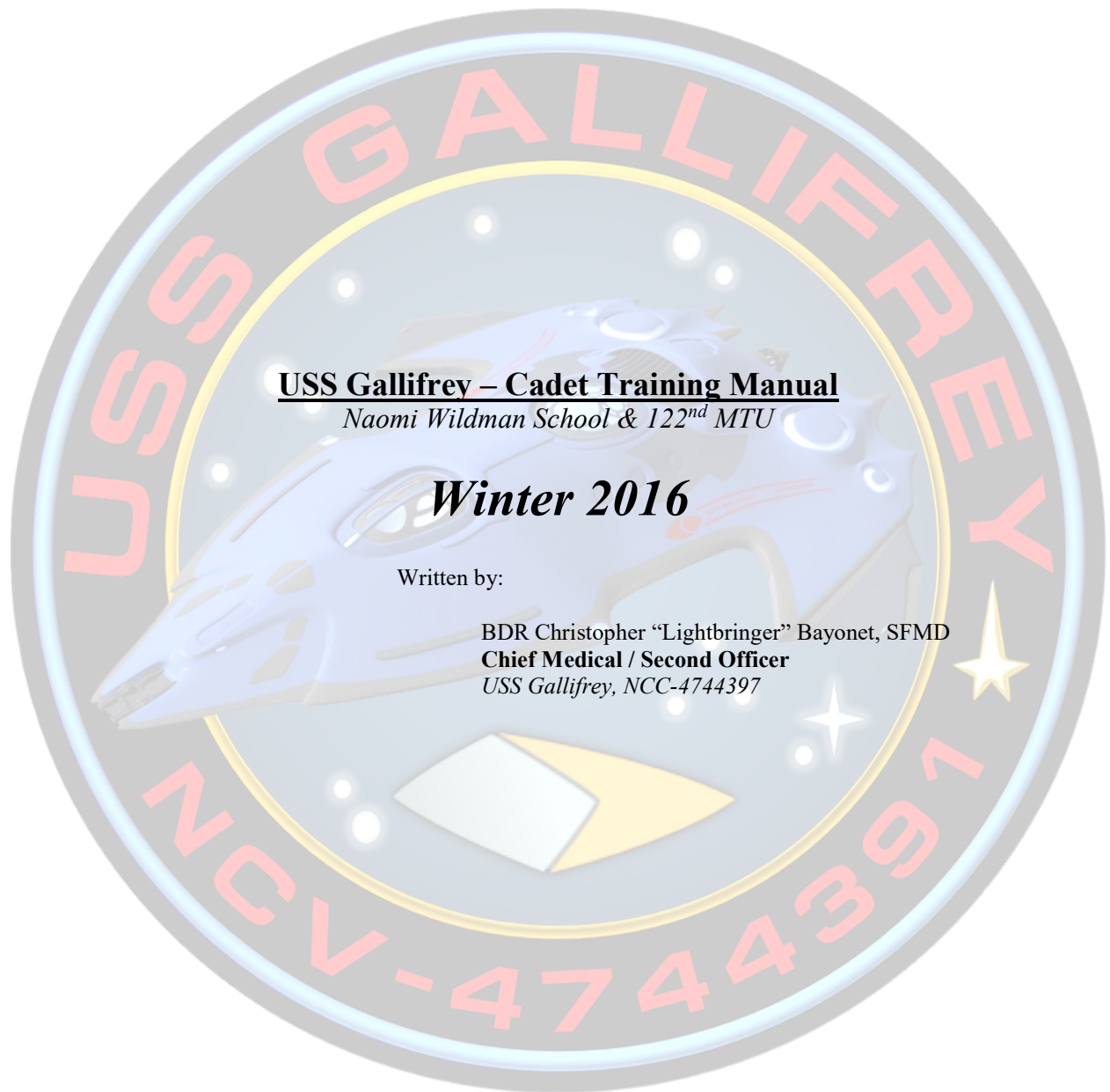

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Cadet Training Program

To accommodate the children onboard the USS Gallifrey the Cadet Training Program has been started to help aid these junior members of the crew on the path to becoming functioning senior members of the crew upon their 18th birthdays.

The purpose of this program is to groom our Junior Members (ages 17 and under) to eventually assume leadership roles not just within STARFLEET but in their mundane lives. It will teach them various life skills as well as provide a structure of reward and advancement for those who excel within it.

Training Units

The Naomi Wildman School

The Naomi Wildman School is the Fleet version of this program. Members who are not part of the MSG shall have their children assigned to the Naomi Wildman School. The children in the Naomi Wildman School shall be directly overseen by the Teacher's Assistant and Resident's Assistant for their scholastic needs.

122nd MTU – "The Ripples"

The 122nd MTU is the Marine version of this program. Members of the MSG's children shall be assigned to the MTU for their training. For the 122nd MTU they shall be overseen by the Cadet Captain and the Cadet Sergeant Major for their training regimen.

Cadet Officers

Senior Crew Members

These Officers must be ages 18 and older, as well as no longer a member of the Cadet Program.

Cadet Training Officer

Cadet Corps Commander Requirements [CCC]: 4 Diplomas from any school offering Cadet courses (including the Cadet Academy), PD-100, PD-138.

The Cadet Training Officer is responsible for the training of our Cadet (under 18 members) as well as seeing their staff "The Cadet Corps." Additionally the Cadet Training Officer in affiliation with the Education Officer shall establish a rewards program (ribbons/commendations) for those that excel in their mundane *and* fleet level scholastic studies.

The Cadet Training Officer will oversee both the 122nd MTU and the Naomi Wildman School. They may at their discretion after a size of 10 cadets in either appoint a Sergeant Major to the 122nd MTU to oversee that exclusively as well as appoint a Headmaster/Headmistress to oversee the Naomi Wildman School.

Sergeant Major, 122nd MTU

Sergeant Major, 122nd MTU Requirements [CCC]: 4 Diplomas from any school offering Cadet courses (including the Cadet Academy), PD-100, PD-138.

The Sergeant Major, 122nd MTU shall have as their primary job to assist the Cadet Training Officer in administrating the MTU when the MTU size exceed 10 Cadets. When enacted the Cadet Captain shall report to the Sergeant Major instead of the Cadet Training Officer.

The Sergeant Major shall also have as part of their duties to create 1 Cadet Program per 3 months to be submitted to the STARFLEET Marine Academy.

The Cadet Training Officer may activate/inactivate this position at their discretion.

Headmaster/Headmistress, Naomi Wildman School

Headmaster/Headmistress, Naomi Wildman School Requirements [CCC]: 4 Diplomas from any school offering Cadet courses (including the Cadet Academy), SAOC 202 & SAOC 203

Headmaster/Headmistress, Naomi Wildman School shall have as their primary job to assist the Cadet Training Officer in administrating the Naomi Wildman School when the school's size exceeds 10 Cadets. When enacted the Cadet Teacher's Assistant shall report to the Headmaster/Headmistress instead of the Cadet Training Officer.

The Headmaster/Headmistress also have as part of their duties to create 1 Cadet Program per 3 months to be submitted to the STARFLEET Academy.

The Cadet Training Officer may activate/inactivate this position at their discretion.

Junior Crew Members

These Officers come from within the Cadet Program and are a method of grooming them for larger responsibilities upon their graduation of the Cadet Program.

Naomi Wildman School

Cadet Teacher's Assistant

Cadet Teacher's Aide Requirements [CTA]: 4 Diplomas from any Cadet Course in either STARFLEET Marine Corps Academy *or* STARFLEET Academy

The Cadet Teacher's Assistant shall be a member between the ages of 13 and 17, and shall work in unison with the Cadet Training Officer to oversee the Cadet Training Program. The Cadet Teacher's Assistant shall write an article for inclusion into the newsletter on items that might pertain to cadets.

Cadet Resident's Assistant

The Cadet Resident's Assistant shall oversee the Cadets and report to the Cadet Teacher's Aide any problems in relation to the Cadets. They shall be the intermediary between the Cadets in the program and the Cadet Teacher's Aide. Additionally, the Cadet Resident's Assistant shall work on development of a Cadet Training Program to help groom the Cadets to become full members of the crew upon their 18th birthday.

122nd MTU – “The Ripples”

Cadet Captain

Cadet Captain Requirements [CCpt]: 4 Diplomas from any Cadet Course in either STARFLEET Marine Corps Academy *or* STARFLEET Academy

The Cadet Captain shall be a member between the ages of 13 and 17, and shall work in unison with the Cadet Training Officer to oversee the Cadet Training Program. The Cadet Captain shall write an article for inclusion into the newsletter on items that might pertain to cadets.

Cadet Sergeant Major

Cadet Captain Requirements [CSGM]: 4 Diplomas from any Cadet Course in either STARFLEET Marine Corps Academy *or* STARFLEET Academy

The Cadet Sergeant Major shall oversee the Cadets and report to the Cadet Captain any problems in relation to the Cadets. They shall be the intermediary between the Cadets in the program and the Cadet Captain. Additionally, the Cadet Sergeant Major shall work on development of a Cadet Training Program to help groom the Cadets to become full members of the crew upon their 18th birthday.

Cadet Ranks

Upon “completion” of Cadet Program (i.e. Turning 18 years old) the Cadet will be transferred to the corresponding rank of Senior Membership provided they fulfill the following requirements within 90 days of their 18th Birthday. These requirements will ensure that each Cadet graduating from the Cadet Training Program possess the skills to excel not only in STARFLEET but in the mundane world as well.

For any Cadet Marine Rank (regardless of Non-Commissioned/Enlisted or Commissioned) the Cadet in question must take and pass PD-100 to transfer over to a Non-Cadet Marine Rank. If they do not, they will transfer over at the applicable Fleet Level equivalent.

Note: These courses may also be taken to fill in any of the requirements for their Cadet ranks. This might be a very worthwhile path for those seeking the Ca-11 and Ca-12 Grades for the Cadet program (Though not required, but to graduate from the Cadet Training Program one must also take these courses).

If a Cadet has achieved the grades of Ca-12 or Ca-13 they will also be required to take and pass the following in addition to the above within the same 90 days of their 18th Birthday or their rank will transfer over as the highest Non-Commissioned Rank available.

Note: Any cadet fulfilling both the Ca-12 requirements and completing both the courses denoted above and those denoted below will also if not fulfilling the requirements for their first Boothsby award, be extremely close to fulfilling them.

Each Cadet shall have a Cadet Project assigned to them for promotions from Cadet Trainees to Cadet Junior Officers (assigned by the Executive Officer [XO]), and from Cadet Junior Officers to Cadet Senior Officers (assigned by the Commanding Officer [CO]). Each Cadet Project shall be personalized for the Cadet in Question.

In the cases of courses that the Cadet in question has “aged out” of the requirements to take; the Cadet Training Officer shall select an alternative class within their age group from the appropriate academy (SFMCA or SFA) for the cadet to take as an alternative.

Cadet Senior Officers

Cadet Senior Officers shall be those Cadets of ages 16 or Older. This track is more intensive with more courses required to advance to and within. This is done to ensure that these cadets are ready to take a place in the world around them. The cadets in question are expected to take those courses which will allow them to graduate from the Cadet Training Program and keep their ranks upon promotion to the Senior Crew.

Cadet Awards

These awards shall encompass the mind, body and community spirit of the cadets. Each award is meant to encourage the cadets to excel in all areas. These Cadet awards may be added to at any time by any member of the Senior Staff of the USS Gallifrey as well as the Cadet Training Officer and Cadet Captain.

The Cadet Captain will need to find a co-sponsor among the Senior Staff and/or Cadet Training Officer prior to any awards they issue being added into the official rolls.

Scholastic Achievement Awards

These Scholastic Achievement Awards are not meant for endeavors within STARFLEET Academy or STARFLEET Marine Academy; they are meant to recognize achievement outside of the various STARFLEET Academies.

Leah Brahms Award of Excellence

This Award of Excellence is awarded to those cadets who during the course of their mundane studies maintain an above average GPA. This award comes in three Orders of magnitude and are as such

- 1st Class – The student has maintained for the period of 1 grading cycle a GPA of 4.0, equivalent to an A+ or “Exceeds Expectations” in all areas.
- 2nd Class – The student has maintained for the period of 1 grading cycle a GPA of 3.5 or Better, equivalent to an A or “Exceeds Expectations” in at least 4 areas.
- 3rd Class – The student has maintained for the period of 1 grading cycle a GPA of 2.5 or Better, equivalent to a B or “Exceeds Expectations” in at least 2 areas.

Unfortunately, due to the nature of this award there are no “Honorable Mentions” able to be noted into the Cadet Files. Being “Average” or merely “Meeting Expectations” is contrary to what the intention is meant to be.

Bronze Cluster

The Bronze Cluster is used to denote those who have achieved these awards while in a 9th to 12th Grade Curriculum.

Silver Cluster

The Silver Cluster is used to denote those who have achieved these awards while pursuing Undergraduate level studies in College.

Note: *The Silver and Gold Clusters are the only Cadet Awards that may by their nature be given to a Senior Member of the crew; the only stipulation is that the member in question must have also received either non-adorned or Bronze Cluster of this award. These versions are “continuation” awards for work achieved while in the Cadet Program to encourage the former Cadets to continue to excel.*

Gold Cluster

The Gold Cluster is used to denote those who have achieved these awards while pursuing Graduate level studies in either College (Masters or PhD Programs), Medical School or Law School.

- The PhD level awards may be denoted with an Open Gold Book adorned in the middle of the award.
- The Law School awards may be denoted with a Gold Quill adorned in the middle of the award.
- The Medical School awards may be denoted with a Gold Caduceus adorned in the middle of the award.
- The Theological awards (if the student has entered the Clergy of their religion) they may display a Golden version of their religious symbol adorned in the middle of the award.

In the case that there can be multiple charges in the award, the cadet in question may at their options display multiples of this award on their uniform/case.

Note: The Silver and Gold Clusters are the only Cadet Awards that may by their nature be given to a Senior Member of the crew; the only stipulation is that the member in question must have also received either non-adorned or Bronze Cluster of this award. These versions are “continuation” awards for work achieved while in the Cadet Program to encourage the former Cadets to continue to excel.

Physical Achievement Awards

The Physical Achievement Awards are to ensure that our Cadets are developing a healthy lifestyle to take with them into their lives around them.

Order of *moQbara*

This award shall recognize those cadets who have excelled in the President’s Youth Fitness Program. The cadets parents shall act in proxy to grade and rate their child in the pursuit of this award. Cadets shall be able to be tested once per 4-months for this award.

Additional issuances of this award will allow the student to “progress” in their belts for this style. These shall be stylized as “Kung Fu” Waist Sashes; listed highest to lowest they are:

1. Grandmaster – 39th Issuance
2. Master – 32nd Issuance
3. Black – 24th Issuance
4. Brown – 18th Issuance
5. Blue – 10th Issuance
6. Green – 6th Issuance
7. Yellow – 3rd Issuance
8. White – 1st Issuance

This award shall be given to each cadet who achieve a grade of “HFZ – Healthy Fitness Zone” in at least one category on their FitnessGRAM.

- 1st Class - The Cadet has scored an “HFZ” in all 5 areas of the FitnessGRAM
- 2nd Class - The Cadet has scored an “HFZ” in 3 to 4 areas of the FitnessGRAM.
- 3rd Class - The Cadet has scored an “HFZ” in 2 areas of the FitnessGRAM,

Even if a Cadet does not meet the requirements for a 3rd Class award, but they have still scored an “HFZ” in at least 1 area of the FitnessGRAM they will receive an “Honorable Mention” to be noted into their Cadet File.

Note: “Honorable Mentions” will not allow a student to advance to the next rank.

Cadets who have consistently made strides towards their Black Waist Sash in the Order of *moQbara* may at their discretion petition the Cadet Training Officer and Commanding Officer for permission to continue that progression after their 18th Birthday, in those cases they will be assigned the Presidential Fitness Award Program to continue to advance.

- PALA+ - Promotion to Green Waist Sash
- Bronze Achievement – Promotion to Blue Waist Sash
- Silver Achievement – Promotion to Brown Waist Sash
- Gold Achievement – Promotion to Black Waist Sash
- Platinum Achievement (1x) – Promotion to Master Status
- Platinum Achievement (2x) – Promotion to Grandmaster Status

Bronze Honor Sash

Additionally, complete 30-Days of the NFL Play60 Challenge (<http://www.nfl.com/play60>). The Cadets parent must verify that this has been completed. The Cadet must have also earned the Yellow Waist Sash (3rd Issuance of the Order of moQbara) to be eligible for this augmentation.

Silver Honor Sash

Additionally, Complete 90-Days of the NFL Play60 Challenge (<http://www.nfl.com/play60>). The Cadets parent must verify that this has been completed. The Cadet must have also earned the Blue Waist Sash (10th Issuance of the Order of moQbara) to be eligible for this augmentation.

Gold Honor Sash

Additionally, complete 180-Days of the NFL Play60 Challenge (<http://www.nfl.com/play60>). The Cadets parent must verify that this has been completed. The Cadet must have also earned the Black Waist Sash (24th Issuance of the Order of moQbara) to be eligible for this augmentation.

Service Achievement Awards

Opaka Sulan Achievement Award

This award is meant to recognize those Cadets who are active in their communities via Community Service. To be eligible for this award the Cadets parents must attest to the completion of these activities.

- 1st Class –
 - 5 to 10 year olds – 75+ Hours
 - 11 to 15 year olds – 100+ Hours
 - 16 to 17 year olds – 250+ Hours
- 2nd Class –
 - 5 to 10 year olds – 50 to 74 Hours
 - 11 to 15 year olds – 75 to 99 Hours
 - 16 to 17 year olds – 175 to 249 Hours
- 3rd Class –
 - 5 to 10 year olds – 26 to 49 Hours
 - 11 to 15 year olds – 50 to 74 Hours
 - 16 to 17 year olds – 100 to 174 Hours

Even if a Cadet does not meet the requirements for a 3rd Class award, but they have still completed at least 10 hours of Community Service, they will receive an “Honorable Mention” noted into their Cadet File.

Bronze Cluster

The Bronze Cluster is awarded to those cadets who exceed the 1st Class requirements by double the required amount of hours.

Silver Cluster

The Silver Cluster is awarded to those cadets who exceed the 1st Class requirements by triple the required amount of hours.

Gold Cluster

The Gold Cluster is awarded to those cadets who exceed the 1st Class requirements by quadruple the required amount of hours.



Appendix I: Cadet Training Worksheet

Cadets are expected to have this sheet completed up to the rank they wish to be promoted to. In some of these cases there will be Marine Rank(s) between Fleet Ranks, the Cadet in question, even if they are following Fleet Ranks, is still responsible for the material at the Marine Rank level. The Marine Ranks offer smaller incremental steps between the corresponding Fleet Rank promotions.

Additionally, in many cases both Marine Cadets and Fleet Cadets will be required to take classes from the other's academy in order to progress up their promotion tiers. This is done intentionally to expose both members to the other Academies.
